ARABIANS THE HORSE FOR EVERY ADVENTURE!

The Arabian horse evolved from the deserts of the Middle East and lived among desert tribes for thousands of years. In harsh conditions, the Arabians' large nostrils helped take in air and their big lung capacity gave them incredible endurance. Their nomad owners shared food and water with their strong horses, and sometimes even their tents too.





Arabians developed a close relationship with their human companions, and a high intelligence too. Today, Arabian horses are one of the most popular breeds and they excel in most equine sports and activities.

The **Arabian Horse Youth Association** (AHYA) makes up about 10 percent of the Arabian Horse Association membership. AHYA is a group of dedicated kids, up to age 18, who take part in Arabian association activities each year like the **Regional Youth Team Tournament**, **Amateur Achievement Awards**, the **Arabian Horse Judging Contest**, the **Creative Contest**, the **Hippology Contest** and more. AHYA members can gain great leadership skills by being club, regional or national delegates and officers.

Thousands of dollars are awarded to AHYA members each year in prizes and scholarships. The awards are open to anyone with an **Arabian Horse Association Youth Membership**.


