Made in America THE AMERICAN QUARTER HORSE

In the 1600s, American colonists began to cross their imported English horses with "native" horses like the Chickasaw. Bred with England's Thoroughbreds, America's pioneers got a small and hardy horse that was a good work horse during the week and a speedy race horse on the weekend.

By the 1800s, settlers were heading West with these willing horses. They bred them with wild **Mustangs**, and other horses that the Native American Indians rode, giving birth to the **American Quarter Horse** of today.





There are many kinds of Quarter Horses, but just two main body types – stock and racing. The stock type is shorter, more compact, with strong muscles and very agile. The racing Quarter Horse is built to sprint short distances. They have longer legs and a leaner build. But both types have speed and stamina and a great willingness to please.



Barrel racing is one of the fastest growing sports in the country, and Quarter Horses excel at it! Winning times can be as fast as 13-14 seconds. Riders sit deep in the saddle and try not to knock over any barrels.

Draw out the racing barrel pattern. Things to remember...you can decide if you want to turn left or right around the first barrel. But remember how you started because, your next two barrel turns must be in the opposite direction of your first
