ay the word "Appaloosa" and many Dependent of the people think "Old West" and "Native American Indian tribes". But Appaloosa history dates back much further than that.

Spotted horses have been found on prehistoric cave wall paintings and on ancient statues and pottery. Appaloosas existed long before recorded history which makes them one of the oldest, most recognizable breeds in the world.

Appaloosas are wonderful animals. They're intelligent, hardy and athletic. But their strikingly colorful coats are their signature characteristic. These splashy, flashy coats can be beautiful combinations of many colors and patterns.

But strangely enough, not all Appaloosas have spotted coats. They can be solid in color. But take a closer look and you'll see some other distinguishing "Appy" features that no other horses



A registered Appaloosa horse could have a white sclera (the area of the eye surrounding the iris). It could have mottled skin (pink & brown) around its muzzle and eyes, and its hooves could be marked with vertical black and white stripes.

Once the favorite mount of the Nez Perce Indians, today the Appaloosa is used for ranch work, trail riding and in parades. They excel in Western classes like pleas-

ure, halter, cutting, reining, and timed events. You'll see them in rodeos too! And best of all, the *Appy* makes a great family horse!


