Why do horses sleep standing up?

Sleeping on their "feet" is useful for an animal that might need to wake up quickly and run from danger. That may not sound very restful for us, but for horses, it's easy. Their legs are made up of a system of bones, muscles and ligaments that lock in place to prop them up safely while they sleep.





How well do horses see?

What a horse can see from 20 feet away, humans can see from 40 feet. But when it comes to night vision, horses see much better than us.
